Madame Marie Curie was one of the greatest scientists in history. She was born on 7 November 1867 in Warsaw, Poland. From her childhood, she showed a keen interest in learning and worked hard to overcome many difficulties in her life. She moved to Paris to pursue higher education and later married the scientist Pierre Curie. Together, they conducted research on 'radioactivity', a term that Marie Curie herself introduced.

Marie Curie and her husband discovered two new elements, polonium and radium in 1898. Their discoveries revolutionized the field of science and opened new possibilities in medicine and research. For their work on radioactivity, Marie Curie, Pierre Curie and Henri Becquerel were awarded Nobel Prize in Physics in 1903. Later in 1911, Marie Curie received the Nobel Prize in Chemistry for her work on radium, becoming the first person to win Nobel Prizes in two different scientific fields. She became the first woman professor at the Sorbonne University in Paris. During World War I, she organized mobile x-ray units that helped doctors to treat wounded soldiers. Her dedication to science and humanity earned her worldwide respect and admiration.

Marie Curie's work greatly advanced scientific knowledge and medical treatment. Although prolonged exposure to radiation affected her health, she never stopped pursuing scientific discoveries. She passed away on 4 July 1934, but her legacy continues to inspire generations of students and scientists around the world.

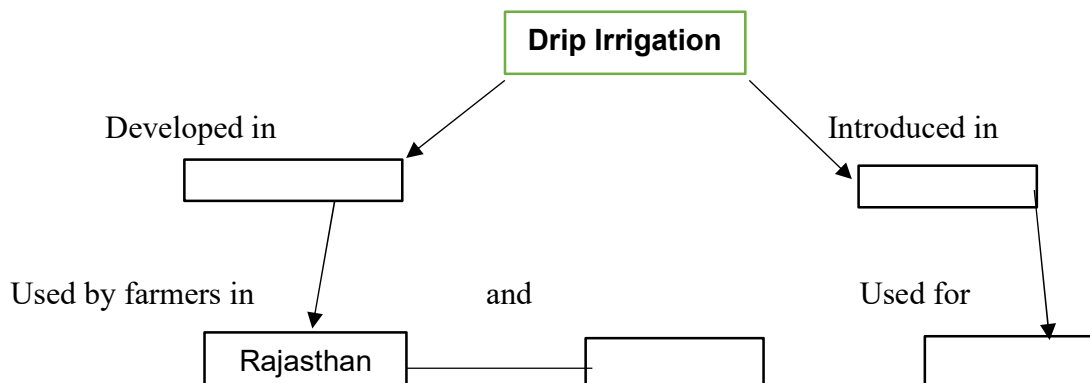
