23rd Divya Kala Mela

Why in the news?

The Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) (DEPWD) will organize the 23rd Divya Kala Mela at Akota Stadium, Vadodara, Gujarat.

- It will be organized from 9th 19th January 2024 through its apex Corporation, National Divyangjan Finance and Development Corporation (NDFDC).
- It was inaugurated by the Union Minister of State (SJ&E), Shri B.L. Verma.

About the Mela:

- It will showcase a diverse range of products and craftsmanship of Divyang entrepreneurs/artisans from across the country.
- It is a unique initiative towards the economic empowerment of PwD/ Divyangjan.
- It presents a big platform for marketing and showcasing the products and skills of Divyangjan (PwD).
- Around 100 Divyang artisans/artists and entrepreneurs from about 20 states/UTs will be showcasing their products and skills.

Global Cooperation Barometer 2025

Why in the news?

The Global Cooperation Barometer 2025 has been released by the World Economic Forum.

- It is the 2nd edition of this barometer.
- It has been developed in collaboration with McKinsey & Company and uses 41 indicators to measure the current state of global cooperation.
- * According to the barometer:
 - International cooperation has 'flatlined', driven by heightened geopolitical tensions and instability.

Objective:

To offer leaders a tool to 'better understand' the contours of cooperation 'broadly' and along five pillars: trade and capital flows, innovation and technology, climate and natural capital, health and wellness, and peace and security.



Economy

Anji Khad Bridge

Why in the news?

Anji Khad Bridge is India's first cablestayed rail bridge.

- Objective: It is designed to enhance regional connectivity and economic growth.
- It is located in the Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir.
- This monumental structure is part of the ambitious Udampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) Project.

About the bridge:

- The bridge, about 80 km from Jammu, spans a total length of 725.5 meters and features a main pylon standing at 193 meters above its foundation, towering 331 meters above the riverbed.
- It can withstand wind speeds of up to 213 km/h and handle a train line with a speed limit of 100 km/h, without posing any risk to the structural integrity.

Tuhin Kanta Pandey has been appointed as the Secretary of the Department of Revenue.

- He will continue to hold the designation of Finance Secretary.
- He is an IAS officer of the 1987 Odisha cadre and was serving as Secretary of the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM).
- Arunish Chawla, IAS officer of the 1992 Bihar cadre, the current Revenue Secretary, has been appointed Secretary of DIPAM

Earth Rotation Day



Why in the news?

Earth Rotation Day is observed on **January 8** every year.

- It celebrates the anniversary of French physicist Leon Foucault's 1851 proof that the Earth rotates on its axis.
 - The day also honours Foucault's first public demonstration in Paris.

History:

- It took several years for philosophers and scientists to work out how the Earth rotates around the sun.
- > It was 470 BC, the Greeks claimed that the earth moved on itself.
- However, in 1851 French Physicist Leon Foucault showed the world's rotation with the help of a pendulum.

He was a multifaceted personality, celebrated for his contributions to journalism, poetry, and Indian cinema.

News in Short

Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of India's first Green Hydrogen Hub (GHH) under National Green Hydrogen Mission, at Pudimadaka in Anakapalli district, near Visakhapatnam on January 8, 2025.

- India's first commercial utilityscale battery energy storage system (BESS) — an inverter that can provide electricity to a grid from renewable energy is expected to operate in Delhi in March, 2025.
- Maharashtra will be the first State to introduce drone surveillance of coasts to keep a stronger check on illegal fishing by trawlers from neighbouring States, primarily from Karnataka, Gujarat and Goa.
