

One of the most unique features of the World's Natural Environment is its forest. Two of the most fascinated forest regions are Equatorial Forests and Taiga Forests.

The Equatorial evergreen forests are thicker or denser than the Taiga forests. Year long rains and abundance of sunshine have helped these forests to be virtually impassable with thick undergrowth occupying every inch of space between the trees, which is one of the reasons why they have remained unexploited. Ebony and Mahogany form the chief tree species which provide some of the hardest timber. The nations of Central Africa and South America would have had a different economy story to tell had their Equatorial forests been easy to exploit.

Taiga forests are relatively less dense and the tree growth is slow because of the scarcity of moisture and less sunshine. Seventy-five percent of the world's timber supply comes from these forests; hence they are commercially very important. The trees are soft wooded and the chief species that grow are pine, spruce and fir. The countries of Norway, Sweden and Canada earn the major portion of their export income from these forests.
