


The Indian Army contingent comprising 334 personnel departed for Nepal to participate in 18th edition of Battalion Level Joint Military Exercise SURYA KIRAN. The exercise will be conducted in Saljhandi, Nepal from 31st December 2024 to 13th January 2025.

Key point

- The Indian Army contingent is being led by a Battalion from the 11th Gorkha Rifles.
- The Nepal Army contingent will be represented by Srijung Battalion.



- * The exercise will focus on enhancing operational preparedness, aviation aspects, medical training, and environment conservation.
- Through these activities, the troops will enhance their operational capabilities, refine their combat skills and strengthen their coordination to operate together in challenging situations.



Jimmy Carter



Former US President Jimmy Carter passed away On 29 December at his home in Plains, Georgia, at the age of 100.

Key Point

- * He was the oldest living President of all time and the third U.S. President to visit India.
- * A Democrat, former President Carter served one term from




1977 to 1981.

- After his presidency, he carved out an extraordinary postpresidency life
- Recipient of the 2002 Nobel Peace Prize for his contributions to resolving global conflicts, fostering democracy, and promoting human rights.

Place in News

Pangong Tso





Key point

- The statue was installed by the Fire and Fury Corps.
- * The installation highlights India's focus on enhancing its military presence and infrastructure in the Ladakh region.
- Pangong Tso is an endorheic lake (landlocked) that is partly in India's Ladakh region and partly in Tibet.
- . Its total area is over 600 sq km.
- Cultural Feature: The name of the lake reflects the mixed heritage of the lake: Pangong in Ladakhi means extensive concavity, the word Tso is Tibetan for lake.
- It is formed from Tethys geosyncline.
- Geographical Features:
- The Karakoram Mountain range, which crosses Tajikistan, Afghanistan, Pakistan, China and India, with heights of over 6,000 metres including K2, the world's second highest peak, ends at the north bank of Pangong Tso.
- Its southern bank too has high broken mountains sloping towards Spangur Lake in the south.
- The lake's water, while crystal clear, is brackish, making it undrinkable. The lake freezes during the winter, allowing some vehicular movement on it as well.

King Cup International Open



Ace Indian shuttler Lakshya Sen secured third place at the King Cup International Badminton Open 2024 after defeating French opponent Alex Lanier in Shenzhen, China.

Key Point

- * The Indian badminton player advanced to the thirdplace match after losing to China's Hu Zhe'an, the reigning junior world champion and current world No 1, in the semi-finals.
- The King Cup International Badminton Open is a newly introduced tournament, initiated by two-time Olympic champion Lin Dan of China.
- * Lakshya Sen, who reached the semi-finals at the Paris 2024 Olympics, was India's sole representative in this invitational tournament.

Youngest Female in the World to conquer the Seven Summits.



Kaamya Karthikeyan, a 17-year-old from Navy Children School, Mumbai, became the youngest female to conquer the Seven Summits on December 24, 2024.

Key Point

- * When she was 16, she made a record by becoming the youngest Indian to climb Mount Everest.
- From her childhood at the age of 7, she went trekking in the mountains of Uttarakhand.
- Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar: India's highest civilian award for individuals under the age of 18, recognizing exceptional achievements in various fields. Kaamya received this honor in 2021 for her mountaineering accomplishments.
