Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Global Peace Award

Indian PM Narendra Modi received an 'honorary' 'Dr.Martin Luther King Jr. Global Peace Award for Minority Upliftment'.




Key Point

- The award was a collaborative effort between Washington adventist University and the Association of Indian American Minorities (AIAM).
- It acknowledges PM Modi's efforts on inclusive growth entrepreneurship activities, and minority welfare measures on the global platform.
- * AIAM is a new non-governmental organization which was inaugurated on November 22, 2024 in Sligo Seventh-day Adventist Church in Maryland, USA to enhance unity among the minority groups within the India American community.

Climate Change Performance Index (CCPI 2025)

India has been ranked 10th in the Climate Change Performance Index (CCPI 2025) report.



Key Point

- This report has been published by Germanwatch, New Climate Institute, & Climate Action Network International since 2005.
- The purpose of this report is to track progress of the world's largest emitters in emissions, renewables, and climate policy.
- It covers 63 countries + the European Union, responsible for 90% of global emissions.
- First three ranks vacant (no country met the "very high" performance criteria).
- Best performing nations includes ;Denmark (4th), Netherlands (5th),
 UK (6th)
- India's per capita emissions stand at 2.9 tons of CO2 equivalent (tCO2e), far below the global average of 6.6 tCO2e.
- India receives a high ranking in the GHG Emissions and Energy Use categories, medium in Climate Policy, and low in Renewable Energy.



World Bank's 'jobs at your doorstep' report

Union Minister for Education Dharmendra Pradhan along with Minister of Labour and Employment Mansukh Mandaviya on 22 November launched a World Bank report titled 'Jobs at Your Doorstep: A Jobs Diagnostics for Young People' that covers six states in India.



Key Point

- The Jobs at Your Doorstep report serves as both a diagnostic and roadmap to providing strategic linkages and convergence between education and the jobs agenda of India.
- It goes deep into the job landscape of six states — Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, and Rajasthan — and identifies key priority sectors and roles that offer the highest employment potential for young people graduating from secondary school.

- The report is a skills gap analysis that attempts to align trades offered in schools industry-specific needs of the districts where the schools are present.
- The study was initiated to reimagine the skill education offered through indepth primary as well as secondary research in six 'STARS' states.
- ❖ The World Bank assists the Ministry of Education with its programme called Strengthening Teaching-Learning and Results for States (STARS) covering six states, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, and Rajasthan (collectively the STARS states).
- STARS Scheme has a national component under which key reforms are shared and disseminated for implementation.

India among top 10 countries with AI readiness

The report by Boston Consulting Group (BCG) based on data from 73 economies showed that India ranks second globally in AI specialists, and third in research publications, with a strong base in AI-related patents.





Key Point

- India is among the top ten countries in Artificial Intelligence (AI) readiness, and the country holds immense potential for public sector transformation through AI, according to a report.
- Readiness" for AI refers to an economy's ability to effectively implement and integrate AI.
- On the other hand, over 70 per cent of the economies studied score below average in critical areas such as ecosystem participation, skills, and research and development.
- The report further showed that Al exposure spans several key sectors in India. Business services account for 16 per cent of GDP and have significant Al exposure, with potential improvements in administrative efficiency for government operations.

ISRO & ASA sign Implementing Arrangement for Gaganyaan

An Implementation Agreement (IA) was signed between Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and Australian Space Agency (ASA) on November 20, 2024 for further strengthening cooperation in space activities between Australia and India.



Key Point

- The deal enables cooperation of both space agencies on crew and crew module recovery for the Gaganyaan missions.
- ❖ ISRO Human Spaceflight or "Gaganyaan" is a space Mission in which India has planned to prove the capability of Human crew module consisting of up to three astronauts to Low Earth Orbit for up to 3 days and return.
- The Memorandum enables the Indian and Australian authorities to cooperate in search and rescue operations and the recovery of the crew module in the event of an ascent phase abort near the Australian waters.



About Gaganyaan mission

Gaganyaan mission is a space mission to demonstrate ISRO's human spaceflight capability by launching a human crew to an orbit of 400 km and bringing them safely back to earth.

Goals of Gaganyaan Mission

The main goals of the Gaganyaan mission are to:

- 1. Show that India can do human spaceflights.
- 2. Learn how to design, build, and use spacecraft for humans.
- 3. Create the needed setup for future human spaceflights.
- 4. To encourage the next generation of scientists and engineers.

State of the World's Children 2024 Report

The United Nation Children's Fund (UNICEF) released 'State of the World's Children 2024' report on November 20.



Key Point

- India will house 350 million children by 2050, making up 15% of the global child population.
- By 2050, nearly eight times more children will be exposed to extreme heat compared to the 2000s.

- Climate crises are expected to disproportionately impact children's health, education, and access to essential resources like water, especially in rural and low-income communities.
- As nearly half of India's population is projected to live in urban areas by 2050, there is an urgent need for child-friendly, climate-resilient urban planning and infrastructure investments.
