# **International**

Nicolas Maduro sworn in for third term as Venezuela's President amid election dispute

### **About News:-**

Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro was sworn in for a third six-year term on



Friday, following a controversial election in which his opponent, Edmundo Gonzalez, accused him of voter fraud and declared himself the legitimate winner.

# **Key points:-**

- Maduro's Rise to Power (2013): Became Venezuela's president after Hugo Chavez's death, facing criticism for authoritarianism and economic crises.
- Contested Election (2018): Opposition leader Juan Guaido declared himself president; US and Western nations recognized him.
- Venezuela's economic struggles, leading 7.7 million citizens to flee due to political repression and instability.
- ❖ July Election Controversy: Maduro claimed victory with 51% of the votes; the opposition alleged irregularities and claimed Gonzalez's victory.
- ❖ Protests and Crackdown: Post-election protests led to 25 deaths and 2,000 arrests.
- Opposition Pressure: Continued protests saw low turnout; Maduro accused the opposition of foreign conspiracy.
- Gonzalez's Asylum: Fled to Spain; met US President Joe Biden to discuss Maduro's repression.
- US Support for Opposition: Referred to Gonzalez as "president-elect" and condemned Maduro's inauguration.
- US Sanctions and Reward: The reward for Maduro's arrest was increased to \$25 million, and sanctions were imposed on eight allies, including oil company head Hector Obregon.

- Encouragement for German Investment: Highlighted India as a major textile machinery buyer and cited the success of a German sewing thread manufacturer in India to encourage others to invest.





- Support for Exporters: The government supports Indian exporters' participation in global events like Heimtextil to enhance visibility and growth in competitive markets.

- PM Modi further remembered former ISKCON chairman Gopal Krishna Goswami, who passed away on May 5, 2024.
- The PM also talked about the 'Krishna circuit,' which is aimed at connecting various pilgrimage and religious sites across Gujarat, Rajasthan, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Odisha.
- Maharashtra Governor CP Radhakrishnan, Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, Deputy CM Eknath Shinde, and BJP MP Hema Malini shared the stage with the PM.

India's GDP growth likely to reach 6.7% next fiscal: Crisil

# About News:-

India's GDP growth is expected to rise to 6.7% in FY25, as per a Crisil report. A steady decline in food inflation and stable non-food inflation may allow room for a rate cut by RBI.





# **Key Points:-**



- Inflation Trends: Headline inflation moving toward RBI's 4% target; CPI inflation dropped to 5.2% in December from 5.5% in November.
- **❖ Food & Non-Food Inflation:** Food inflation eased to 8.4%, non-food inflation stable at 3.1%.
- ❖ Economic Indicators: IIP rose to 5.2% in November; GDP growth was estimated to moderate to 6.4% this fiscal but improved to 6.7% in FY25.
- Agriculture: Higher reservoir levels to boost rabi crop output, farm incomes, and rural consumption, easing food inflation further.

# **Bombay & Delhi High Courts Get New Chief Justices**

### **About News:-**



The central government on Tuesday issued a notification confirming Justice Alok Aradhe, currently chief justice of the Telangana High Court, as the new chief justice of the Bombay High Court. The notification also confirmed the transfer of Justice Devendra Kumar Upadhyaya, currently serving as chief justice of the Bombay High Court, to the chief justice of the Delhi High Court.

# **Key Points:-**

- ❖ Aradhe, 60, began his legal career in 1988. He was appointed as an additional judge in the Madhya Pradesh High Court in December 2009 and as a permanent judge in February 2011.
- He was then transferred to the high court of Jammu and Kashmir, where he took oath as the acting chief justice in 2005 and served till 2018.
- In 2023, he was appointed chief justice of the Telangana High Court.
- His transfer to the Bombay High Court is being seen as a move to strengthen judicial leadership in one of India's busiest high courts.
- Justice Upadhyaya, who has been appointed chief justice of the Delhi High Court, was born in 1965 and began his legal practice in 1991.
- His legal career was primarily centered on civil and constitutional law at the Allahabad High Court.
- ❖ After serving as the chief standing counsel for Uttar Pradesh from 2007 to 2011, he was appointed as judge at the Allahabad High Court in November 2011 and was elevated to permanent judge in August 2013.
- He served as the senior judge of the Lucknow bench before being appointed as chief justice of the Bombay High Court in July 2023.

# **Science & Technology**

India's sixth and eastern India's first astronomical observatory was inaugurated at Garpanchkot Hills in Purulia

### **About News:-**

A new observatory established by the S N Bose Centre for Basic Sciences atop Panchet Hill in Purulia, West Bengal, will aid in astronomical observations, and telescope training for students, and foster national and international collaboration in research. It will also address the longitudinal gap in scientific observations.





## **Key Points:-**

The observatory at a height of 600 meters above ground level and at a longitude of approximately 86° E, will be a major observatory not only in eastern India but also in the world.



- ❖ Along the 86-degree East longitude stretching from the Arctic Ocean in the north to Antarctica in the south, there are very few observatories.
- This observatory will fill that gap. Renowned astrophysicist and Vice Chancellor of Ashoka University opines that to observe transient astronomical phenomena lasting a few minutes to a few hours, it is important to have good observatories on all the longitudes of the globe.
- Therefore, the Panchet observatory is strategically positioned.
- S.N. Bose Centre has signed an MOU with Sidhu Kanu Birsa University for joint responsibility of running the observatory and sharing resources.

India successfully tests Indian Army's first 'Bhargavastra' counter-drone micro missiles

### **About News:-**



India has successfully tested its first domestically developed micro-missile system, engineered to counter swarm drone threats. The testing included two successful firings at the Gopalpur Seaward Firing Ranges this week. The new micro-missile system, being developed for the Indian Army, successfully engaged virtual targets beyond 2.5 km, demonstrating an economical solution against large-scale drone attacks that pose a continuous security challenge.

## What is the Bhargavastra micro-missile system?

- The counter-drone system, 'Bhargavastra', demonstrates the capability to detect small aerial vehicles at ranges exceeding 6 km and neutralise them using guided micro munitions.
- The Bhargavastra system features simultaneous launch capability of over 64 micro missiles.
- Economic Explosives Ltd is developing this mobile platform-mounted system, ensuring rapid deployment to threat areas.
- Its design accommodates operations across various terrains, including high-altitude regions, meeting specific military requirements.
- As the first micro missile-based counterdrone system developed for Army Air Defence, it addresses a crucial capability gap. The Air Force has also expressed significant interest, with few comparable systems existing globally.
- ❖ The widespread availability of affordable drones, particularly in swarm formations, presents significant challenges to armed forces traditionally reliant on costly air defence missiles for asset protection.
- There is a pressing need for cost-effective systems targeting drone threats, whilst preserving advanced air defence systems for more substantial threats.

MHA approves expansion of CISF with two new battalions

### **About News:-**

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has approved a major expansion of the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), which will create two new battalions.





Each newly sanctioned battalion will consist of 1,025 personnel. bringing the total number of **CISF** battalions from 13 to 15 and creating 2,050 new posts.




### **Kev Points:-**

- Both battalions will be led by officers of senior commandant rank. These units will play a crucial role in addressing increasing demands on the CISF, particularly in areas security such as internal and the management of high-security jails.
- This move, alongside the recently sanctioned Mahila Battalion, is expected to bolster national security while generating over 2,000 new jobs.
- With this expansion, the CISF's total strength will rise to nearly two lakh personnel.
- The reserve battalions consist of personnel specifically trained and equipped who are experienced in handling the security of highsecurity jails and other undertakings.
- The additional battalions will significantly improve the CISF's rapid response during capabilities emergencies. The availability of dedicated reserve units, well equipped with a transport fleet and sufficient weapons, means faster deployment and more effective management of critical situations, further enhancing

public safety and security.

"The new strength will reduce stress on existing personnel and translate into improved leave and weekly relief opportunities for personnel," CISF Inspector General Ajay Dahiya said.





- The CISF is one of India's Central Armed Police Forces, established under the CISF Act, of 1968. Initially created to provide integrated security to the public sector undertakings (PSUs), the CISF has since evolved into a multifaceted security agency responsible safeguarding critical for infrastructure across the country.
- \* The force protects industrial key installations, government buildings, nuclear and space establishments, airports, seaports, and historical monuments, including the Taj Mahal. Additionally, CISF offers consultancy services in security management to both public and private sector organizations.
