2025 Indian Army Day to be held in Pune, Maharashtra

Key Points:

Pune, Maharashtra, will host the Indian Army's ceremonial annual 2025 Army Day on 15 January 2025. This was announced during the launch of the parade's promotional video, which features Bollywood stars R. Madhavan and Rakul Preet Singh, at the ongoing International Film Festival of India (IFFI) in Goa.



Why is Army Day celebrated?

- Army Day marks an important transition in the Indian Army, where the command was formally vested in an Indian. Even after independence on 15 August 1947, the Chief of the Army Staff was a British officer.
- On 15 January 1949, an Indian General, K M Carriapa, took over as the Chief of the Army Staff from the British General Sir Roy Butcher. To commemorate this momentous event in the Indian Army, 15 January is observed as Army Day in India every year. On this day, the officers and Jawans of the Indian Army conduct an impressive parade.

Third Army Day Parade outside New Delhi

- Traditionally, the Army Day Parade was held in New Delhi, where the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force headquarters are located.
- In 2022, the Narendra Modi government decided to hold the annual Army Day, Air Force Day, and Indian Navy Day Parades outside New Delhi in other parts of the country.

According to the government, the decision to hold the Armed Forces annual parade was made to involve the public in these celebrations, instil a sense of pride in the armed forces amongst the public, and promote national unity.

Rotation of the Army Day

- The government has decided to rotate the annual Army Day parade among the Indian Army's six operational commands.
- First time in 2023, the Army Day Parade was held outside New Delhi, Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- In 2024, it was held in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh.

Center launches AbKoiBahanaNahi Campaign to end violence against women

The government of India launched a nationwide "#AbKoiBahanaNahi" and "Nayi Chetna 3.0 "campaign on 25 November 2024 in New Delhi on the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. The campaign, which will run until 10 December 2024, which is Human Rights Day, will focus on raising awareness against genderbased violence and the need to end it.



Who inaugurated the Campaign?

- The #AbKoiBahanaNahi" campaign was inaugurated by Annpurna Devi, Union Minister of Women and Child Development.
- On this occasion, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, the Union Minister for Rural Development, Kamlesh Paswan, and Dr Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani, the Minister of State for Rural Development and Communications, were present.
- Women leaders from Self Help Groups across the country and service providers for redressal for survivors of violence against women and girls were also present during the launch of the campaigns.

Aim of the #AbKoiBahanaNahi" Campaign

- The main of the #AbKoiBahanaNahi" Campaign are as follows:
- Advance the rights of women and individuals of diverse genders.
- Free their lives from fear and gender-based discrimination.
- Empower women to break free from shame and societal constraints, enabling them to report the atrocities they have faced and fight for their dignity.



- Sensitise the general public on ending gender-based violence.
- Send a message about women's safety as a fundamental and non-negotiable national growth and development priority.

International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women

Key Points:

- Since 1994, 25 November has been observed annually as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women.
- The United Nations General Assembly passed a resolution on 7 February 2000 to observe 25 November as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women.
- The United Nations launched the UNITE to End Violence against Women initiative in 2008 to support the civil society-led 16 Days of Activism against Gender-based Violence campaign around the world. The campaign starts on 25 November and ends on Human Rights Day on 10 December.

Theme of the 2024 International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women

The UN Women has chosen "Every 10 Minutes, a woman is killed. #NoExcuse. UNITE to End Violence against Women" as the theme of the campaign for 2024."

What is the project, Why you need to upgrade your PAN card

Key Points:

❖ The 10-digit alphanumeric Permanent Account Number (PAN), issued by the Income Tax Department, is set for an upgrade, with a QR code to be incorporated in all new and old cards, a completely online application process, a merger of all existing identification numbers to make PAN as the common identifier for

- businesses, in addition to a data vault system for data protection and cybersecurity purposes.
- The Union Cabinet approved the PAN 2.0 Project on Monday (November 25) for PAN to be made the "the common identifier for businesses" and to make PAN as the "single source of truth and data consistency".
- With the upgrade, PAN is expected to become a strong source of identification and information for the authorities, as it is already linked to the other identification number of Aadhaar.
- The existing PAN holders, which are around 78 crore in number, can upgrade their PAN cards. The number or PAN will remain the same for existing users, but the card will need to be upgraded, which the government said would be free of cost for the users.

PAN Card

- PAN on a physical card referred to as the PAN card. The PAN card includes information, such as the PAN number, photograph, name, and date of birth of the holder. PAN has a typical format of ABCTY1234D. The first three characters, i.e. 'ABC' in the above number is an alphabetic series ranging between AAA and ZZZ.
- The 4th character, i.e. 'T', represents the PAN holder's status. The alphabet 'T' represents Trust, 'F' for Firm, 'H' for HUF, 'P' for Individual, 'C' for Company etc.
- ❖ The 5th character, i.e. 'Y', represents the first alphabet and the PAN holder's last name. The next four characters are sequential digits ranging between 0001 and 9999. The 10th character, i.e. 'D', is an alphabetic check digit that runs from A to Z.



Utility of PAN

- PAN enables the department to identify/ link all transactions of the PAN holder with the department.
- These transactions include tax payments, TDS/TCS credits, returns of income, specified transactions correspondence etc, and so on.
- It facilitates easy retrieval of information of PAN holder and matching of various investments, borrowings and other business activities of PAN holder.

What is the PAN 2.0 Project?'

- The PAN 2.0 Project of the Income Tax Department, with a financial implication of Rs 1,435 crore, was approved by the Union Cabinet on Monday.
- ❖ Under the project, the existing PAN system will be upgraded completely, the IT backbone will be revamped and PAN will be made as a common business identifier for all digital systems of specified government agencies, Union Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said during the Cabinet briefing on Monday.

What are the features of PAN 2.0?

- Apart from the QR-code feature for all new and existing PAN cards, the PAN 2.0 project aims to set up a unified portal along with a "mandatory PAN data vault system" for all entities using PAN data.
- This is being done for data protection and cybersecurity purposes. "One of the most important features would be a PAN data vault system. The PAN related information is used by many entities such as banks, insurance companies.
- We give details of PAN at various places. So, those (entities) who take details of PAN, they will have to keep PAN data safely, mandatorily through the data vault system," Vaishnaw said.

There will also be a unified portal as the existing software is nearly 15-20 years old, Vaishnaw said. "It'll be completely paperless, online. A lot of focus will be on the grievance redressal system," he said.

What does this mean for individuals and businesses?


Existing users will have the option to upgrade for the PAN 2.0 card. The details about the application process and the timeline are yet to be released by the Income Tax Department. The QR-code feature on new and old PAN cards will mean an enhanced level of integration of financial transactions with the tax department. The QR code was introduced in PAN in 2017. The PAN 2.0 project intends to continue with this feature with enhancements, tax officials said.

Indian Constitution in Sanskrit and Maithili language launched

Key Points:

- President Droupadi Murmu unveiled the Indian constitution's translation in Sanskrit and Maithili language in New Delhi on 26 November 2024 on the occasion of the Samvidhan Diwas. Maithili is mainly spoken in Bihar, Jharkhand, and Nepal. Vice President and Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, and other dignitaries were present at the occasion.
- The government of India has undertaken a project to translate the Indian constitution into all 22 scheduled languages mentioned in the 8th Schedule of the Constitution.





The 75-year celebration of the Indian Constitution

- This year marks 75 years of the enactment of the Indian constitution. The Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Indian constitution on 26 November 1949, which was promulgated on 26 January 1950.
- Since 2015, 26 November has been observed in the country as the Samvidhan Diwas. A function was held in the Parliament's Samvidhan Sadan to observe the Samvidhan Diwas and the 75th anniversary of the adoption of the constitution. The old Parliament building has been renamed Samvidhan Sadan by the Modi government.
- On the occasion, President Droupadi Murmu addressed a joint sitting of both houses of Parliament, the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha.

Main events of the function

- President Murmu led the members of the Parliament in reading the Constitution's preamble.
- A commemorative coin and stamp dedicated to the 75th anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution of India was released.
- Release of Books titled "Making of the Constitution of India: A Glimpse" and "Making of the Constitution of India & its Glorious Journey"
- Release of Booklet dedicated to the Art of the Constitution of India.
- Release of the Constitution of India in Sanskrit.

❖ To mark the 75th year of the adoption of the constitution, the President also launched the year-long campaign titled "Hamara Samvidhan, Hamara Swabhimaan" on 25 November 2024. The year-long campaign will remember and honour the contributions of the Constitution's makers and reiterate the core values of our Constitution.

History Teacher Yamandu Orsi elected new President of Uruguay

- A teacher of history, folk dancer and former mayor, the 57-year-old Yamandu Orsi has been elected as the new President of Uruguay.
- In the Presidential run-off election held on 24 November 2024, Yamandu Orsi secured 49.8 per cent of the votes, compared to Alvaro Delgado of the centre-right National Party, who secured 45.9 per cent votes.
- It was due to this reason the incumbent, President Luis Lacalle Pou, did not contest the election.



Yamandu Orsi will succeed the current President, Luis Lacalle Pou, in March 2025. The Uruguayan President is elected for a term of five years and is not eligible for immediate reelection.

- Amir Ali was also captain of the Indian hockey team that came at the third place and won the bronze medal at the U-21 Sultan of Johor Cup held in Malaysia in October 2024.

The title was won by Great Britain by defeating Australia in the final.

About Men's Hockey Junior Asia Cup

The Men's Hockey Junior Asia Cup is for the under 21 year players. It is organised by the Asian Hockey Federation. India has been the most successful team in the Championship with four title wins in 2004, 2015, 2008 and 2023. Pakistan has won it three times in 1987,1992 and 1996.

India's first Constitution Museum inaugurated at OP Jindal University


Key Points:
