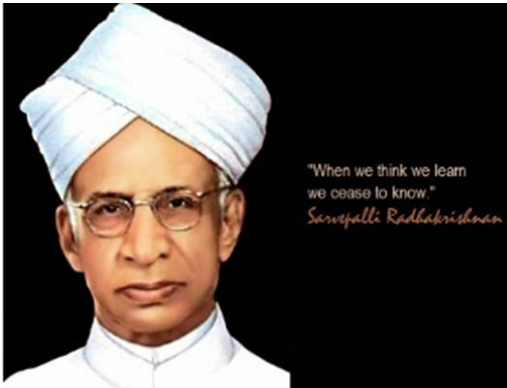




### Teachers' Day

The history of Teachers' Day in India dates back to 1962 when Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, a distinguished academic and statesman, became the President of India.

When some of his former students and friends approached him with a request to celebrate his birthday, he humbly suggested that instead of celebrating his birthday, it would be more meaningful to dedicate the day to honouring teachers across the nation.

Since then, September 5 has been observed as Teachers' Day in India, a day dedicated to recognising the contributions of educators.

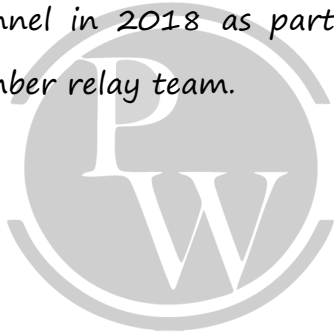

## The oldest Indian to swim across the English Channel

Siddhartha Agarwal, a 49-year-old Bengaluru-based swimmer, achieved a significant milestone by becoming the oldest Indian to swim across the English Channel. Agarwal completed the 42-kilometer swim from England to France in 15 hours and six minutes, as reported by Swim Life in a press release. Previously, Agarwal had crossed the Channel in 2018 as part of an eight-member relay team.
