Stubble Burning

The Centre has increased penalties for farmers involved in burning crop stubble as part of efforts to tackle worsening air quality in Delhi and neighbouring regions.

Key Points

- The new rules are called as Commission for Air Quality Management in the National Capital Region and Adjoining Areas (Imposition, Collection, and Utilisation of Environmental Compensation for Stubble Burning) Amendment Rules, 2024.
- Under the new rules, which take effect immediately, farmers with less than two acres of land will face a fine of Rs 5,000.
- Those with between two and five acres will be fined Rs 10,000, while farmers with more than five acres of land will be penalised Rs 30,000 for engaging in stubble burning.
- The amendment is part of the government's push to reduce air pollution under the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) Act of 2021.

What is Stubble Burning?

The stubble burning, an **easy method of discarding crop residues from the fields**, adopted mostly by farmers of the rice-wheat growing belt of India, often posing challenges to environment and human health.

- Burning of paddy stubbles in the field has become a common practice in the Indo-Gangetic plains during the months of October and November to grow subsequent wheat crops.
- Resolution on 'Conventional arms control at the regional and subregional levels'

India voted against a resolution by Pakistan on 'Conventional arms control at the regional and subregional levels'.

Key Points

- The resolution was put by Pakistan and Syria on 'Conventional arms control at the regional and subregional levels' in the First Committee of the UN General Assembly.
- It was adopted by recorded vote with 179 members voting in favour, an abstention by Israel while India was the sole country voting against the resolution.
- The resolution recognises the "crucial role of conventional arms control in promoting regional and international peace and security."
- The First Committee of the UNGA deals with disarmament, global challenges and threats to peace that affect the international community.

Digital Population Clock

On November 8. Bengaluru launched its first digital population clock at the Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC).

Key Points

- The clock showcases real-time population estimates for Karnataka and India.
- This initiative, a collaboration between ISEC and the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW).
- It aims to increase awareness of population dynamics and provide accurate data for research.
- The clock updates Karnataka's population estimate every minute and 10 seconds, while India's total ticks up every two seconds.



Hurun India Philanthropy List 2024

According to the EdelGive-Hurun India Philanthropy List 2024 has been released.

Key Points

- Shiv Nadar, the founder of HCL Technologies, has retained his position as India's most generous philanthropist for
 - the third time in five years. He donated Rs 2,153 crore in the financial year 2024 (translating to Rs 5.9 crore every single day).



- ❖ Rohini Nilekani, co-founder of Infosys and wife of Nandan Nilekani, took the lead as the most generous woman on the list with an annual donation of Rs 154 crore.
- Nikhil Kamath, co-founder of Zerodha, has become the youngest philanthropist featured in the EdelGive-Hurun India Philanthropy List 2024 at just 38 years old.
- Mumbai remained the city with the highest concentration of philanthropists in the list, accounting for 30% of the total, followed by New Delhi at 19%, and Bengaluru at 9%.
