10th India Maize Summit

Why in the news?

The 10th India Maize Summit was organized by the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) in New Delhi.

Focus of the summit: It focussed on the rising demand for maize and strategies to boost production in the future.

Highlights of the summit:

- The FICCI-YES BANK report titled 'The Indian Maize Sector - Trends, Challenges & Imperatives for Sustainable Growth' was released.
 - According to the report, global maize production reached 1.17 billion tons in 2022, with India positioned as the fifth-largest producer.
 - Bihar's Minister of Agriculture & Health, Mangal Pandey, addressed the summit, emphasizing the state government's commitment to supporting the agricultural sector.

- Bihar's contribution in the country's maize production is about 11 percent.
- After Andhra Pradesh,
 Karnataka, Rajasthan and
 Maharashtra, Bihar is the
 fifth-largest maize-producing
 state in the country.
- Purnia, Katihar, Bhagalpur,
 Madhepura, Saharsa, Khagaria
 and Samastipur have developed
 as major areas of maize
 production.
- * A separate Bihar Agriculture

 Investment Promotion Policy has

 been introduced to encourage

 investment in the field of agriculture.
 - Under this, one can avail capital subsidy of up to 25 percent in the field of seed processing to food processing.
 - Maize producing farmers are also benefiting from the state government's Ethanol Promotion Policy, 2021.

India's first CO2-to-methanol pilot plant

Why in the news?

India's first CO2-to-methanol pilot plant will be established in Pune, Maharashtra.

- Abhay Karandikar, Secretary to the Department of Science and Technology (DST), laid the foundation stone at Thermax Limited in Pune, Maharashtra.
- Objective: It aims to advance indigenous carbon capture and utilization (CCU) capabilities.

About the plant:

It has a capacity of 1.4 tons per day, and is being developed under a public-private partnership (PPP) between the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi and Punebased engineering company Thermax (NSE: THERMAX).

ABHED LightWeight Bullet Proof Jackets

Why in the news?

DRDO, along with researchers of Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi has developed LightWeight Bullet Proof Jackets.

- It has been named as ABHED (Advanced Ballistics for High Energy Defeat).
- The jackets have been developed at the DRDO Industry Academia

 Centre of Excellence (DIA-CoE) at IIT, Delhi.

About the Jacket:

- These jackets have been created from polymers and indigenous boron carbide ceramic material.
- The design configuration is based on characterisation of various materials at high strain rate followed by appropriate modeling and simulation in collaboration with DRDO.

- History: IRFA (Indian Research Fund Association) was redesignated as the Indian Council of Medical Research (with Dr. C.G. Pandit as its first Director).
- It is funded by the Government of India through the Department of Health Research, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.

Next Vice Air Chief: S.P Dharkar

Why in the news?

Air Marshal SP Dharkar has been appointed as the next Vice Chief of Air Staff.

He will succeed Air Marshal AP Singh who will assume his role as the 28th Chief of Air Staff from 30th September onwards.

Why in the news?

It is observed every year on September 25, which commemorates the birth anniversary of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay

- History of this day: It was first observed in 2014.
- Focus: It focuses on uplifting the most disadvantaged people in society, promoting Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay's vision of social justice and inclusive growth.

Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay

- Pandit Deendayal was born in the Mathura district of Uttar Pradesh on September 25, 1916.
- He was a prominent Indian political thinker and founder of the Bharatiya Jana Sangh.
- He is known for his philosophy of Integral Humanism and Antyodaya, which emphasizes the welfare of the last person in society.







News in Short

- The Mizoram government has introduced a new initiative called Bana Kaih to support small entrepreneurs and farmers.
- Sports Minister Surendra Mehta inaugurated Bihar's first sport climbing wall at the Patliputra Sports Complex in Patna.
- Justice M.S. Ramachandra Rao has been sworn in as the Chief Justice of the Jharkhand High Court.
