Hints & Solutions

Q1 Text Solution:

The error lies in part (3), "cheerful persons." The phrase "a cheerful persons" is incorrect because "a" is a singular article and must be followed by a singular noun.

"Persons" is plural.

Therefore, the correct phrase should be "a cheerful person."

Q2 Text Solution:

An **Anarchist** is someone who believes in the absence of government and law, often leading to disorder. This term comes from "anarchy," which means a state of disorder due to the absence of authority.

Answer: D (an Anarchist)

- Naxalite- (in South Asia) a member of an armed revolutionary group advocating Maoist communism.
- Autocrat- a ruler who has complete power.
- Monarchist- a supporter of the principle of having monarchs.

Q3 Text Solution:

The correctly spelt word is **B** (illustrious), which means well-known, respected, and admired for past achievements. The other options are misspelled:

impromptue should be impromptu.

illusery should be illusory.

impetous should be **impetuous**.

Answer: B (illustrious)

Q4 Text Solution:

The abstract noun of "patient" (adjective) is **patience**. Abstract nouns refer to concepts, qualities, or conditions that cannot be experienced with the five senses, and patience is the quality of being patient.

Answer: B (Patience)

Q5 Text Solution:

Optimistic means hopeful and confident about the future.

The opposite (antonym) is **pessimistic**, which means expecting the worst or seeing the negative side of things.

Answer: D (Pessimistic)

Ophthalmology- the branch of medicine concerned with the diagnosis and treatment of disorders of the eye.

Q6 Text Solution:

Idiom: Draw the line at something
The idiom means to set a limit on what one is
willing to do or accept. It indicates a boundary
beyond which one refuses to go.

Correct Answer: C (Accept something up to a particular point)

Q7 Text Solution:

Explanation:

To change an active voice sentence in the future tense to passive voice, you can interchange the subject and object, and change the verb form.

Active voice: "He will play chess"
 Passive voice: "Chess will be played by him"

Structure in Passive Voice (future tense):- Object + will/shall +be + V3+ by +...

The object is 'food'. V3 of 'cook' is 'cooked'.
'I promised my husband that' will be as it is.
Correct passive - I promised my husband that food will be cooked by me.

Q8 Text Solution:

Q13 Text Solution:

C (had worked): Incorrect; this is past perfect tense, indicating a completed action before another past action.

D (worked): Incorrect; this implies a past action that is completed.

Q19 Text Solution:

A **misogynist** is a person who dislikes or despises women

Correct Answer: B (Misogynist)

Other Options:

- A (Misanthrope): A person who dislikes humankind.
