



Nag Mk 2 Anti-Tank Guided
Missile





Key point

- Developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), the missile is part of India's Integrated Missile Development Program, designed to bolster the Indian Army's anti-tank warfare capabilities.
- The Nag Mk 2 is equipped with advanced infrared and fire-and-forget technology, making it a highly accurate and adaptable weapon system.
- This development marks a significant step towards enhancing India's defense capabilities in modern warfare.

Key point

25th National Conference of Chairpersons of State Public Service Commissions



The 25th National Conference of the Chairpersons of PSCs held in Bengaluru on 11 January 2025

Key point

- The Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) has been designated as the coordinator for all legal issues concerning Public Service Commissions (PSCs) in India.
- TGPSC will also provide subject experts for various topics to assist PSCs across the country.
- The decision was made during the 25th National Conference of the Chairpersons of PSCs.

* About SPSCs

- > SPSCs are established under Articles 315-323 of the Indian Constitution (Part-XIV).
- These articles define the structure, powers, and functions of Public Service Commissions at the Union and State levels.
- The Governor appoints the members of the SPSC under Article 316.
- Individuals who have previously served as members of an SPSC cannot be reappointed to the same position
- Members serve for a term of 6 years or until the age of 62 years, whichever is earlier.

Anju Bobby George



Anju Bobby George, the iconic long jumper and 2003 World Championships bronze medalist, has been appointed as the Chairperson of the Athletics Federation of India (AFI) Athletes Commission.

Key point

- The newly formed commission includes nine prominent athletes, six of whom are women, highlighting a move towards gender equality within the AFI.
- Among the male members, Neeraj Chopra, a twotime Olympic medalist, stands out as a key figure.
- The commission's composition includes other distinguished athletes such as runner Jyotirmoyee Sikdar, discus thrower Krishna Poonia, and steeplechaser Sudha Singh.
- Anju Bobby George, also a Senior Vice-President of the AFI, is entrusted with leading the commission in promoting greater athlete representation, advocating for their rights, and ensuring their voices are heard.

National Turmeric Board



Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, inaugurated the National Turmeric Board in New Delhi on 14 January.

Key point

- Palle Ganga Reddy was appointed as the first Chairperson of the Board
- Headquartered National Turmeric Board in Nizamabad.



- The Board will focus on key areas such as research and development, value addition to turmeric products, and promoting awareness of the spice's medicinal and essential properties. It will also work on improving turmeric yield, enhancing logistics and supply chains, and exploring new international markets for turmeric.
- India is responsible for over 70% of the world's turmeric production, with 30 varieties of turmeric being grown in the country.
- Turmeric, often referred to as the "Golden Spice," holds immense economic potential for Indian farmers, particularly those in 20 states including Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, and Meghalaya.
- In 2023-24, turmeric cultivation covered an area of 3.05 lakh hectares in India, with a yield of 10.74 lakh tonnes.
