- Also known as Rani Saha (60), she finally received Indian citizenship after a 40-year wait.
- She has been living on a visa in Bihar's Ara's town ever since she got married to an Indian citizen.





## Metro Network in India

# Why in the news?

On January 5, Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation for multiple development projects worth over Rs 12,200 crore in Delhi.

It included the inauguration of the 13 km stretch of the Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut Namo Bharat corridor.







- With this growth, India has surpassed Japan in Metro Rail Projects in 2022.
  - Currently, India ranks third globally in operational Metro network length and is on track to become the 2nd largest Metro network in the world.

## History of Metro in India

- In 1969, the initiative for a metro system was launched through the Metropolitan Transport Project.
- 1984: The first metro line in India, covering 3.4 km between Esplanade and Bhowanipur, opened in Kolkata. This marked the beginning of metro life in India
- \* 1995: The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) was established to bring world-class Mass Rapid Transport to Delhi. The project gained momentum with joint participation from the Central Government and the Government of Delhi
- 2002: DMRC opened its first metro corridor between Shahdara and Tis Hazari in Delhi, setting the stage for one of the country's largest metro networks

- 2011: Namma Metro's (Bengaluru Metro) first segment was built
- 2017: Chennai's metro expanded with the inauguration of its first underground section on the Green Line, from Koyambedu to Nehru Park, marking a key milestone for Southern India's metro development
- 2020: Phase 1 of Kochi Metro was completed, with the Thykoodam-Petta stretch commissioned, making Kerala part of the growing metro network in India.
- Under-Water Metro: In 2024, PM Modi inaugurated India's first under-water metro tunnel in Kolkata, where the Esplanade-Howrah Maidan section passes beneath the Hooghly River.
- Driverless Metro: On December 28, 2020, India launched its firstever driverless metro service on Delhi Metro's Magenta Line, setting a new benchmark for automation in public transport.
- \* Kochi Water Metro: Kochi, Kerala, became the first city in India to launch a Water Metro Project, connecting 10 islands around the city with electric hybrid boats.

# Why in the news?

India got its first baby of this gen on New Year's Day, January 1, in Mizoram's Aizawl.

The baby boy named Frankie Remruatdika Zadeng, was born at 12:03 am on January 1 at Durtlang's Synod hospital in Aizawl, making him the first birth of Generation Beta.

#### Gen Beta

Futurist Mark McCrindle coined the term 'Gen Beta' to define babies born between 2025 and 2039, saying that by 2035 they will make up for 16 percent of the global population.

## Santosh Trophy

Why in the news?

West Bengal defeated Kerala 1-0 to win the Santosh Trophy.



## About the trophy:

- Started in 1941, the Santosh Trophy is one of Indian football's legacy tournaments. It is the national football championship for men.
- The Santosh Trophy is named after the former Maharaja of Santosh (now in Bangladesh), Sir Manmatha Nath Roy Chowdhury, a legendary figure in Indian football.
- West Bengal, then named Bengal, went on to win the inaugural Santosh Trophy title in 1941-42 after beating Delhi Delhi 5-1 in the final.
- In fact, West Bengal is also the most successful team in Santosh Trophy history, having won the title 33 times while finishing runners-up on 14 occasions.

National Bird Day is celebrated on January 5 every year.


- It is a day dedicated to raising aware-ness about the importance of birds in our ecosystems and their conservation.

  - It will provide comprehensive training and support to help women entrepreneurs engaged in traditional snack production to scale their ventures sustainably and effectively.


