Answer: The Buddha adopted the following ways to spread his message-

- b) He encouraged his followers to think independently. He was against his followers following him blindly. Such free thinking helped the followers to arrive at conclusions on their own which spread Lord Buddha's teachings even further.

Buddha preached being kind to animals. He was against animal sacrifice.

b) True

After attaining enlightenment, Buddha taught for the first time at Sarnath. He attained enlightenment in Bodh Gaya.

c) False

'Karma' is action, what we do. Buddha taught that our karma affects our lives, both the present life and the next lives.

d) True

Buddha meditated under a Peepal (Banyan) tree in Bodh Gaya. After several days of meditation, he attained enlightenment here.

e) The individual soul is the Atman while the universal soul is the Brahman. Followers of the Upanishads were of the belief that the Atman and the Brahman were the same.

Q.3 What were the questions Upanishadic thinkers wanted to answer?

Answer: The Upanishadic thinkers sought answers to the questions below:

- a) What occurs after death?
- b) Is there life after death?
- c) Why should we perform sacrifices?
- d) Does the Universe have anything permanent that lasts even after death?

Q.4 What were the main teachings of Mahavira?

Answer: Mahavira's main teachings were as follows:

- a) Those wishing to know the truth must leave their homes.
- b) It is a must for those on the path of truth to abide by the principles of Ahimsa (Non-violence) very strictly.
- c) Since life is dear to all, one must not hurt or kill any living being
- Q.5 Why do you think Anagha's mother wanted her to know the story of the Buddha?

Answer: Anagha was travelling on a school trip to Varanasi. Buddha taught for the first time at Sarnath, a place in Varanasi after attaining enlightenment in Bodh Gaya. Since the story and message of the Lord Buddha are inspiring, Anagha's mother was keen for Anagha to know about them.

Q.6 Do you think it would have been easy for slaves to join the Sangha? Give reasons for your answer.

Before joining the Sangha, everyone, except men had to take permission from their masters. Children needed permission from their masters, servants from kings, wives from their husbands and slaves from their masters.

It must have been difficult for slaves to join the Sangha since,

- a) Slaves enjoyed little or no rights at all
- b) Not all slaves would have kind masters
- c) In general, the society was dependant on the slaves to have all its tasks done by them. Hence, no master had any incentive to permit his slave to join the Sangha.

Discussion:

a) What did Lord Buddha attempt to teach Kisagotami?

Explanation: Kisagotami was taken to Buddha after she lost her son. Buddha asked Kisagotami to get mustard seeds from any house where there had been no deaths. Kisagotami found no such house with a son, a daughter, a father, a mother, a grandmother or a grandfather having died in one house or the other. Through this lesson, Buddha wanted to convey the message to Kisagotami that death is part of the cycle of life and none can avoid it. Therefore, none should lose hope even if a loved one is lost. It's a teaching that's very important today as well.

b) How did the beggar convince sages to share food with them?

Explanation: The sages were worshippers of the universal soul. The beggar proved that he too was part of the universal soul and hence, the sages shared their food with him. It shows that we are all a part of the universal soul or Brahman and hence, we must respect all living beings.
